

TWO POSITIONS IN COMPUTING SCIENCE

- Academic Rank:** Assistant Professor (tenure track). Highly qualified candidates may be considered at higher rank.
- Starting Salary:** \$54,000 and up. The University College also provides generous benefits.
- Application Deadline:** May 31, 2010, or when filled
- Starting Date:** July 1, 2010
- Institutional Requirements:** To be considered for appointment, the candidate must wholeheartedly endorse the Mission Statement and the Statement of Faith of the University College (see <http://www.kingsu.ca/about-us/>). The successful candidate must demonstrate graduate level course work in the areas of teaching. A Ph.D. in computing science is preferred for tenure track appointment; consideration will be given to applicants with masters degrees in computing science or doctorates in related areas.
- Teaching Load:** 4 term courses per year or equivalent, including labs and seminars.
- Research Duties:** All tenure-track faculty members are expected to engage in scholarly activity (some combination of discovery/integration/application/pedagogy) and to publish results.
- Professional Duties:** All tenure-track faculty members serve the community in various ways out of their expertise and share in faculty administration.
- Particulars of the Positions:**
The successful candidates should be able to offer a range of courses in computing science, are committed to a faith-based approach to the discipline, and will be interested in teaching and obtaining external funding to conduct research with undergraduate students. The appointments will share the responsibilities for the delivery of the 4-yr B.Sc. degree in computing science with existing faculty members in the Computing Science Department and the Faculty of Natural Sciences.
- Appointment:** Subject to program development and budget approval
