Faculty Opening

The Mathematics Department of Liberty University invites applications for one full-time, permanent position at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor, beginning in August 2016. A master's or doctoral degree in Mathematics or Statistics is required. Applicants should be prepared to instruct lower-level and upper-level courses, including those needed to support Liberty's growing School of Engineering.

Liberty University is a teaching institution, and the successful candidate would also need to enthusiastically participate in the department's general education mathematics course offerings. Class sizes for these courses can be up to 60 or more students, so the candidate would need to be comfortable in this environment. Faculty have a 10 month appointment, with a 24-30 hour teaching load. Faculty teach undergraduate courses, advise students, contribute to departmental and university initiatives, perform departmental service, and contribute to the mission of the university.

A completed application file includes a c.v., a completed institutional application form, official undergraduate and graduate transcripts, four letters of recommendation (three professional and academic, and one pastoral), and written statements of the candidate's Christian experience, philosophy of education, and integration of faith and discipline (described in the application). Liberty is a Christian institution that requires faculty subscription to an evangelical doctrinal statement (including statements on biblical inerrancy, six-day creation and salvation through faith in Jesus Christ) and adherence to a Christian lifestyle (including abstention from alcohol and tobacco). The Mathematics Department is comprised of collegial faculty who emphasize a commitment to Christ and the Scriptures, a dedication to teaching, and a Christian perspective on science.
